RIVERINA CARNIVAL - ATHLETICS

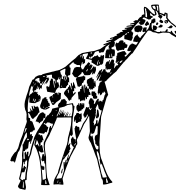
The following children made up the PP5 Small Schools Relay Team which competed at the Riverina Carnival on Friday at Albury.
