Tell The From Me Survey (Students in Years 4/5/6)

This term, our school, like many other public schools in the state, will participate in a Department of Education initiative: the *Tell Them From Me* student feedback survey. Students in Years 4-6 complete the survey. The survey measures factors that are known to affect academic achievement and other student outcomes. The focus of the NSW-wide survey is on student wellbeing, engagement and effective teaching practices. The survey is a great opportunity for our students to provide us with valuable and quick feedback on what they think about school life, how engaged they are with school and the different ways that teachers interact with them. I want to assure you that the survey is confidential. The survey is conducted online and will typically take less than 30 minutes to complete. Participating in the survey is entirely voluntary. A consent form and FAQs for parents/carers about the survey is being sent home today with students. If you do not want your child or children to participate, please return the form to school by Friday, April 5.

Kickstart for Kids – Expression of Interest

We are looking at recommencing our **Kickstart For Kids** program in the coming weeks and require additional enrolments. Small Schools Soccer Team.




LNPSSA Rugby Union Gala Day
